

Rainmeter Tutorial for Beginners!

Rainmeter allows you to display customizable skins on your desktop.

Rainmeter uses very little hardware resources and will run perfectly well on any PC using Microsoft Windows 7 through Windows 11.

Download the **freeware Rainmeter** from the following link:

Basics

- Install Rainmeter
- Once it's installed, it should automatically load some skins on your desktop.
- Right click on any desktop skin and will appear a pop-up menu from where you can choose "Manage skin" and this will open "**Rainmeter's main menu**". There you can **load** or **unload** any skin you have installed.
- You can locate the skins directory at *the **Documents** > **Rainmeter** > **Skins***

Installing Skins

- Downloaded skins are **.mskin** files. Simply run the file and it will automatically get added to your **rainmeter menu**.
- Select any skin in the Rainmeter menu and load it!

Editing Skins

- Each skin is different, but when personalizing your desktop, you'll want to play around with the skins by clicking 'edit'. For example:

-Most skins' colors are in the RGB format, so you'll see something like
Color:
255, 145, 0, 200; the last number is the transparency value.

-You can change the position of a skin by dragging it around your
screen.
